Well done, Jensen you have achieved a Pass - your project submission meets all assessment criteria and is of a satisfactory standard.

Context – You have incorporated more of the context in to your project with details on the professional industry and where your product might sit, as well as some of the limitations of the industries expectations. The context lacks real research with more specific examples, there is no Harvard referencing to demonstrate that you have researched this rather than writing what you already know. You have an awareness of the professional context but this is so limited and could have been significantly enhanced with relevant research.

Research – Your aim for this project was to 'professionally produce and release an EP', this defines the required research to be focused on production and promotion. For the production there is no evidence of any research. The production techniques under research contains no sources, it is all subjective opinion-based ideas. The whole purpose of research is to develop ideas and enhance your product with this. The lack of any detail in the production section also fails to provide any sources. The mastering section is the same, there is a quote within this section but it not applied. The whole purpose of research is that you apply it where relevant to develop your work and your understanding. The promotion section is the same, just opinion-based material with no context to actual sources.

This was highlighted in your interim feedback and should have been developed to ensure you achieve a higher grade. There is some research that uses external sources in your work, for example the PRS section in copyright laws, this is enough to provide the pass criteria but there is not enough detail and research for the key areas of your project. You state in your weekly reflections that the research is going to be left until later but this is the wrong way to approach this. The research should inform your decision and underpin what you intend to develop, simply writing about what you already know does not achieve this.

Problem Solving – As identified in your interim assessment your focus has been too much on the production of the tracks and there is no evidence of problem solving in the production of these track (because there is no production evidence, except the final tracks). There is not a significant amount on problem solving, which is a shame as there was a lot of problems that you solved throughout the process, for instance how did you solve the issue with sample rights? You have discussed some problem solving within the weekly reflections but there is no significant analysis of this, which means that you have not provided much detail on this.

Planning and Production – your initial planning was very detailed with clear weekly objectives, unfortunately this does not seem to have

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transpired to the project. The initial planning is still there but no of it excluding the track production has been realized. You have managed to provide some elements of completed work but all the production process is missing, as it the research, and the promotional aspects. This is a great shame as if you had followed your plan you would have completed all the work most successfully and also not lost the tracks on Ableton before creating the screenshots or screen capture.

Practical Skills – You have produced some excellent tracks but there is still no evidence to demonstrate this, no screen shots, no videos, no screen casts. This was required from the start and should have been documented throughout the process. Losing the tracks is not an excuse for this, as you should have demonstrated the process of creating the tracks, explaining the tracks after they are completed does not facilitate this. You seemed to lose focus on the EP work as soon as you completed the music. The focus moved to performing the tracks which was never intended from the aims of the project. Although it is good to perform the tracks it would have been far more useful to focus on the EP documentation rather than the performance. Again, this is a great shame as it limits your grade severely.

Evaluation and Reflection – No overall evaluation of the entire project, there is evaluation on the performance but this was not part of the project aims. The weekly reflections provide some insight in to the projects progression and development but a lot of the detail that should have been provided is missing, with the focus on personal and emotions rather than the progress and strengths/weaknesses of the project. There is no evidence of the Gibbs reflective cycle that you proposed to use. There is no reflection or evaluation of the tracks production techniques or any on the promotional aspects of the EP.

Presentation – Your digital space presents your work well with clearly laid out tabs. The graphic design you used for your logo is very effective and professional and the collaboration was definitely a good idea. Overall the presentation is very suitable and works well as part of a Soundcloud release. With more applied research this could have been far more successful.

Jensen, this is a very disappointing grade, at the beginning of the project the projected grade was around distinction which has now dropped to a bare minimal pass. There is so much evidence missing, no production notes, little research, vague evaluation. The work you did in preparation for this was excellent and it is a shame this did not cross over in to this project.

Second Marker Comments:

Jensen, this is a very disappointing portfolio given the excellent work you completed in your proposal. You have not adhered to your plan or explained why your project has not been completed to it's potential. You have completed and released some original music which is of a high standard, however, there is no documentation to show the process that you went through. It seems as though you disengaged with the project after a couple of weeks and this is represented by your portfolio submission. You are capable of a much higher grade and I hope you manage to engage fully in the future when you progress to university.
