## **Project Development**

Did you meet your stated aims?

I surprised myself as I managed to achieve everything I set out to, the main goals were to not only create a piece based in my inspirations but also to develop a new skill along the way, I accomplished this which makes me extremely proud.

How does your work compare with your professional research?

Of course, the work I researched is of a much higher level than mine, but for a complete novice I believe I did extremely well at bringing my ideas to life as well as being ambitious in my production, I also believe the way I managed to take on and act upon information was effective.

Did you make any changes? Why? How did your concept develop?

The only changes I made were to the way I did things and not the ideas themselves, for example I was using an extremely simple method to remove people from my image and as a result of this it looked extremely messy, I then decided to do some research into a slightly more complex solution and removed the people in a way that was more seamless and kept a level of detail in the image that I was satisfied with.

Does the finished product appeal to the target audience?

My target audience is very wide and as a result I believe that my product does in fact appeal to them, I would say the main people interested in my product would be ages 18-24.

How well does the product reflect your skills and the things you have learned this year?

I believe my product shows how I managed to develop my skills from my research as they coincide with each other throughout the entire project, which can be seen in not only my research page but also my production page, I think with the time frame we were given I did an excellent job of developing a skill that I did not previously have.

Is it an accurate reflection of your skills? Are you proud of it?

It is most certainly a reflection of the skills I have developed and that is evidenced across my entire project, I am proud of the work I have done as not only do I believe that the piece is good for a novice's first attempt, I also believe that the speed in which I developed my skills is impressive.

What would you do differently next time? What did you learn?

Because I am now equipped with the knowledge of how to do pieces of work like this; I think next time I would like to complete more than one image, I would also have liked to start my project earlier than I did, but unfortunately I was a victim of my own procrastination, I learned a lot in this project such as blending, shadowing, clone stamping, content aware filling, layer masking and other things such as colour balancing, which all played a major part in making my piece what it is.

What would you do differently if you had a larger/unlimited budget?

I would have done 2 things:

1. Hire a coach who specialises in image manipulation
2. Buy an even more powerful pc so that my edits could be even more ambitious

**Final Product**
