## Comments:

Well done Carys, you have completed this project to a good standard. The work submitted meets all the assessment criteria and is of a high standard. This portfolio shows glimpses of excellence at times through the organisation and documentation of your work, however there is a lack of depth to all areas of the matrix that limited your grade to good.

Context - You have provided some good overall context and research all of the compositions you completed, especially for the ensemble composition and moving image composition. The introduction works well to set out your aims. You could have given a definition of a composer and explained the importance of composition within the music industry to show your understanding. There was a short scoring task based on the diatonic chords in the key which was useful and a description of how you used Sibelius.

Research – There is a variety of good research on display here, although much of it we completed in class. In order to achieve excellent, there must be independent research as well. Make sure you use roman numerals when analysing and discussing chords. You displayed the circle of fifths but it would have been even better if you showed how this information could be applied to songwriting and analysis. You analysed Beth's theme well but with no commentary on structure, rhythm or melodic devices. The analysis of the song 'One Kiss' is very limited and incorrect. Using a wider range of sources and Harvard referencing will allow you to achieve an excellent grade.

Practical Skills - You have documented the process of composing in a small ensemble in detail. Your final performance of this live composition was confident. You worked well with other members of the group and communicated well throughout the project. You could have more input in the future in terms of melodic content. Your electronic composition demonstrates that you can use logic to a very high standard - however, some of the samples do not always work harmonically with the track you have created. Your moving image composition showed some originality and fitted the video well. This composition showed the synchronization between the video and audio.

Evaluation and Reflection - Your evaluations are thorough and present through most of your work. You reflected on the fact that you did not have the correct tone for the piano in the final performance and that you could have practiced more. I agree with this and it is important that you have noticed these areas for improvement to develop in future projects. You included a project evaluation that linked all three compositions together and the general importance of the skills you have developed throughout the project.

Overall, there is a good range of work on display for all three compositions and you should be proud of your work. This submission shows you are clearly capable of an excellent grade with a little more in depth and independent work
