Hours: 8pm – 4am (8 hrs shift) Notes: Must be able to drive a buggy Dates: Fri 28th July – Sunday 30th July Payment terms: 3 days employment @ £84.00-day rate based on 8hr shift

- Assisting the Stage Manager to ensure the smooth running of the stage & dressing rooms from Friday Sunday.
- Collect riders from Artist Liaison, check them and distribute to the correct dressing rooms.
- Cleaning / tidying dressing rooms & toilets.
- Liaising with artists & crew
- Assisting with sound checks, load ins / outs.
- Communicate with Production / Artist Liaison as required.
- Driver preferred, 18+.
- Must have previous stage management / production / artist liaison experience.
- Expect to work long hours, with breaks, to ensure that the stage is suitably always staffed. The Artist Liaison Manager will allocate shifts.
- You will be required to arrive at the festival site on <u>Thursday 28th July</u> to complete your H&S inductions, familiarise yourself with the site and pitch your tent.
- Take messages, equipment to staff in other areas of the site using golf buggies
- Transport artists/performers off site as required
- Get supplies from off site as required
- Take messages, equipment, food to staff in other areas of the site by foot




In The Dock Stage (second stage) Runner 1

Hours: 10am – 8pm (10 hr shift) Notes: Must be able to drive a buggy Dates: Fri 28th July – Sunday 30st July Payment terms: 3 days employment @ £105.00-day rate based on 10hr shift

- Assisting the Stage Manager to ensure the smooth running of the stage & dressing rooms from Friday Sunday.
- Main direction from Stage Manager and Artist Liaison Manager.
- Collect riders from Production, check them and distribute to the correct dressing rooms.
- Cleaning / tidying dressing rooms & toilets.
- Liaising with artists & crew once they are delivered to your stage area from Artist Liaison.
- Assisting with sound checks, load ins / outs.
- Communicate with Production / Artist Liaison as required.
- Driver preferred, 18+. Confident driver.
- Must have previous stage management / production / artist liaison experience.

Working from the Production office for the Production Manager on shift at the time, duties can include but not limited to:

- Take messages, equipment to staff in other areas of the site using golf buggy
- Driver preferred, 18+.
- Transport artists/performers off site as required
- Get supplies from off site as required
- Help with dressing rooms if required
- Help with the Vendor re-stock on Sat & Sun mornings if required
- Manage the junior runners
- Provide support for Production Manager and Event Control
- Take messages, equipment, food to staff in other areas of the site by foot
- Clean & check artist toilets 7am, noon, 6pm (minimum)
- Tidy Production office & Event Control office
- Empty bins and litter pick backstage
- Get hot drinks for staff in Production, Event Control, Artist Liaison, Accreditation
- Man, the radio sign in / out in Production office if cover required.
- Help Artist Liaison Manager service the dressing rooms, if required
- Carry out any 'running' duties as required by the Welfare & Information ten
