Commentary as appropriate:

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Well done Barbora, you have achieved a Distinction - your project submission meets all the assessment criteria and is of a very high standard. You composed, developed, recorded and performed four very professional songs. Each song was effectively completed and a range of skills were developed through this process, such as lyric writing, developing chord progressions, playing piano, recording in the studio and performing in front of a camera. You also collaborated on several other projects and were a key member in helping other students realise and achieve their projects.

Context – You discuss the context of your project in your proposal. You have showed that you understand the context of music performance and songwriting throughout your project. You have linked these topics to the wider industry and looked at singer songwriters as examples. You demonstrated an excellent understanding of the professional expectations of you as a performer.

Research – You have documented lots of primary research through the development of your songs that you have carried out for your original songs in the form of audio files, videos and journal entries. These are accompanied with chord charts, lyrics and reflections. You have some limited research into your inspirations. More detailed and sustained research is needed for a higher grade. You could have used more of the sources identified in your proposal to achieve this.

Problem Solving – You have overcome numerous theoretical and practical problems throughout the songwriting/rehearsing process, music video shoot and recording/mixing process. You handled the final performance very well where you were the main performer and had to lip sync to video.

Planning and Production – You have demonstrated, through the creation of four successful recordings and videos, that you have planned this project successfully. You have evidenced planning and production through preproduction plans, including chord progressions, lyrics, liaising with other students and tutors. There is also evidence of planning and performing in several other projects. You coordinated regular rehearsals and o ensure you were studio ready before the organised date.

Practical Skills – You have worked hard to develop your songwriting skills as well as rehearsing on your original material. You have documented this process through video and audio files. Your final songs are extremely well written, and you have shown the creative process on your portfolio. I was particularly impressed with your final performance. You were confident and engaging throughout the final recordings and videos. You have demonstrated your unique vocal quality and songwriting skills with the inclusion of a song in Slovakian which everybody thoroughly enjoyed. Excellent work!

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Evaluation and Reflection – You have evaluated throughout the project. Rehearsals and demo songs are accompanied by written evaluations. You used your journal to document progress and changes. You also evaluated your final songs. Similarly, it would have been useful to evaluate your project overall, stating what you gained from completing this project, what could be improved and what you hope to achieve in the future.

Presentation – Your final presentation of your performance was excellent, engaging the audience throughout. You structured your song accordingly and introduced each song clearly. You have presented your songs on soundcloud and your work is documented well, both in journal form and on digitalspace.

Barbora, you should be very proud of your four successful originals songs and captivating video performance. There is certainly a career for you to contemplate in live performance. You worked throughout this project and thoroughly achieve this grade. Lots of the audience have commented on how brilliant your voice and your songs are. Overall, this project was a great success – well done!
