Commentary as appropriate:

Well done Isaac, you have achieved a Distinction – your project submission meets all the assessment criteria and is completed to a very high standard.

Context – Your proposal has been written in a lot of detail. You have clearly self-assessed, taking on board what the tutors and your peers have said. For your project your plan change, you clearly justify your reasoning for changing this plan to a more realistic goal in the timeframe that you had. In your plan you have had a clear understanding from the start on how you were going to progress throughout your project, you've known what important elements of this project needed a lot of time and attention (mixing and promotion). As well as this you've also looked into detail on the resources you were going to be using (studio, MIDI keyboard and mac).

Research – Your research is comprehensive and you have implemented this into your final track. You have researched genres from the original DOOM soundtrack and how you would like to implement these sounds and structures into your own work. As well as this you have looked being a "Self Promoting Composer", on this page you looked at skills that you have used in this project, such as collaboration and promoting your own work. With promoting your own work you have even reflected on your progress, to further extend on this you could have included other apps as well as Instagram, including Facebook or Twitter. As well as this you could have talked about boosting posts, referencing the digital marketing talk that was done on the 28th of May. For further research different types of marketing campaigns could have been explored. For the mixing process you had done extensive research into using different tools within your workstation, this includes your EQ instrumental breakdown graph.

You had also listened to the advice from your tutors on your project presentation proposal. You explored the storyline, giving you a great amount of detail on how the music was created, as well as insight into themes, instruments and effects used on the track. Great work.

Practical Skills – You have clearly demonstrated your progress in your practical skills from week one, showing an in depth understanding of your project. It is clear that the research you have carried out has had a positive impact on the work you have done. Through the write ups you reflect on what has gone well and what has not, coming up with creative solutions to your problems. To further demonstrate your practical skills you could do a screencast, running through your project to show in a bit more detail your production. You have gained so many skills through doing this project and this is demonstrated through your weekly reflections. For the practical skills of this project you have shown in depth knowledge and skills. Well done.

Evaluation and Reflection – You have a good perception of your learning journey, as this is seen throughout your ongoing reflections in your project. In your final evaluation you have implemented a reflective cycle, this is very impressive as this demonstrates clarity and sophistication in your reflective process. In your reflection you have covered skills that can translate to other projects, such as, time management and communication. As well as this you have also reflected on more specific skills within the project such as arrangement. For your next project you could dive deeper into covering more specific skills like this, such as mixing in more detail. You have shown great progress through this project and you should be extremely proud of yourself! Well done.
