Well done Adam you have completed this project to a satisfactory standard. The work submitted meets all the assessment criteria and is of a satisfactory standard.

Ensemble Performance (assessor JD)

Adam, you worked hard during the rehearsals and your excellent attendance helped with making sure that you played a big part in getting ready for the performance. You played cajon on one track, but it was good to see you challenge yourself to play bass on two tracks. I know this was new to you, and you did a good job on 'She's Electric'. On the other track you did start on the wrong sequence, and played this throughout! Try and make sure you've got the part learnt as well as possible, and keep working on your technique and fluency. Your blog is well put together and you've included rehearsal footage, with reflection on each clip and improvements moving forward. The final performance video is included and you have also reflected on this. As you've mentioned, as an audition, it might be better to focus on your drumming, but you did a good job and you should be pleased with how you've applied yourself.

Community Music Workshop (assessor LB)

Adam, you context and research for this project is to a good standard, you have explored a range of case studies and helped provide the underpinning theory to why you were completing these workshops. The plan and practical was very detailed and it was evidence in the session that you as a group had worked effectively to ensure an excellent workshop. Practically you could have engaged more with the students but this was largely due to nerves I imagine. Your evaluation is effective but could have been less descriptive and more concise, what are you actually saying was effective or needed improvement.

Christmas Showcase Performance (assessor NS)

You successfully performed an online music show in which you only had 5 weeks to prepare for. This is a good achievement and one you should be proud of! You were a committed member of your band and were responsible for communicating with the rest of your ensemble. You learnt all the material for your band as well as performing with a larger ensemble on a new instrument (whole group performance on glockenspiel). You could have documented your performance on this instrument (glockenspiel) further with pictures and commentary. You successfully showcased music performed by yourself and your peers as well as educating the audience about the existence of your course. There are multiple videos documenting the rehearsal process and plans made for the live show. Unfortunately, the live show could not happen due to Covid-19, however, you showed good professionalism and problem-solving skills by moving the show online at very short notice. Performing in front of a camera is very different to performing in front of an audience and you coped with the pressure well. Your performances were completed to a good standard with a short final performance. You were a key member of your group for this showcase and without you it would not have taken place. There could be more detailed evaluations as well as more detailed documentation of the rehearsal process and problem solving you completed. Well done Adam – a thoroughly enjoyable performance and show!
