The quality of the final song, given the limitations of working from home, is excellent.

Context – The extensive range of research into the history of song demonstrates investigation into the context of songwriting. You have investigated some of the different areas of songwriting. You have briefly outlined job roles and responsibilities and research further research into this top alongside professional standards could also be considered in the future to show a greater awareness of the industry.

Research – There is an extensive range of research that is presented in your digital space, this demonstrates your ability to search for a range of material that is relevant in content. Be careful that your research is also applied to your practical skills – i.e. recording and mixing. The purpose of research is to develop your knowledge and provide a framework for you to build upon. For instance, how does the research on Billie Eilish/Finneas inform your ideas and decisions on your songwriting practice? You have Harvard Referenced your sources but do not forget in text referencing where necessary.

Practical Skills – You were a core member of your songwriting group, providing ideas and parts for several instruments. You helped structure the song alongside recording and producing the final mix. The quality of the final song is excellent and the quality of the recording is good for a home recording. There are several things to learn from this process, such as improving the timing of the parts through using a click and the lack of lower frequencies as there is no bass part.

Evaluation and Reflection – The honesty of your evaluation is good and helps the development aspects of the work. The weekly journal for songwriting show ongoing evaluation and reflection. Your final evaluation is detailed and identifies areas to develop in future.

Overall, for your first attempt at songwriting and a home recording and mix – this is an excellent effort! You also performed as a key member of your songwriting group on several instruments. I think songwriting, recording and production is an area you should pursue further in the future.
