You have analysed extra live performances considered the aspects of live performance and how it relates to your project. You also considered a range of job roles/

Research – a detailed and extensive research portfolio that demonstrates wider reading and understanding. The inclusion of a risk assessment is very wise. The range of sources could be extended and Harvard Referencing could be implemented to ensure there is no plagiarism, otherwise an excellent piece of work. There was scope to extend this with equipment/settings research.

Practical skills- You have documented rehearsals and the development of your ensemble well. You stayed on task throughout the project during rehearsals and worked well with other members of your group, including extra rehearsals where necessary. Your piano skills clearly developed throughout the project. You developed as a musician and performer throughout the course of the project, culminating in a confident final performance. You need to work on some of the more technical issues such as getting the right keyboard sounds for each song. You could have improved your timing in some of the songs and this is something to work on in the future.

Evaluation and Reflection - Your evaluations and reflections are ongoing and detailed. You executed evaluations at many stages of the project. You could consider audio/video evaluations in the future.

Live Performance – Your performed most of your parts with accuracy and confidence. Your nervousness, if there was any, did not come across to the audience. Well done!
