Commentary as appropriate:

Well done Blake, you have completed this project to a Merit standard. The work submitted meets all the assessment criteria and is of a high standard.

Context – You have defined the context of your project as an opportunity to 'to write and produce an electronic single using Ableton with accompanying artwork to be released on sound cloud.' The relation between developing skills in music performance in combination with music recording and production is directly related to the context of the industry and is relevant for the IDM genre you wish to create. You also contextualise IDM through citing a variety of appropriate artists such as Aphex Twin.

Research – You have documented extensive secondary research into synthesis and practitioners who inspire you. You have identified good examples of music similar to your own style that demonstrates your ability to find suitable and relevant research, although it does not always to inform your own practice. You have also conducted some good primary research with your drum tutor to gather different opinions on recording drums. However, you have not applied this research directly to your project. You have incorporated some ideas into field recordings that you have provided but they have not been used in your experimentations or tracks. There is no Harvard referencing. Your research could have been excellent if you had applied your findings more directly to your music creation.

Problem Solving – You have explained a range of issues you encountered during the progress of your project, particularly in the recording of the drums and experimentation phases. These issues are provided with solutions but it would have been beneficial to discuss the impact of these problems on your project and how you not only solved the issues but worked to prevent further issues occurring in the time frame of your project.

Planning and Production – You have provided a plan that maps your intended project with detail and clarity, you have also tracked this throughout the project demonstrating your ability to document your progress against an initial plan for the first half of the project. However, the production of your final track, although it has been completed successfully, was rushed and therefore you did not meet your initial project aim, to incorporate drum recordings and synthesis.

Practical Skills – You have applied music production skills effectively in the production of your final track. This demonstrates your ability to write, record and mix a complete product to a good standard in a short space of time. This could have been excellent if you had been more committed



and focused to the final product. You have clearly evidenced the development of these skills throughout the experimentation page on your digital space as well as your recording skills through the drum recording page. You have a lot of talent as an electronic music producer Blake but I do not feel you realised your potential in this area.

Evaluation and Reflection – You have evaluated the project throughout the timeline although this is documented rather briefly at times. There are some brief evaluations of experimentation ideas that provide an analysis of the progress throughout the project and how you adapted to meet the final deadline. The final evaluation summarises the project and is honest. It identifies the weaknesses and areas of improvement for future projects – particularly how the final track was rushed and didn't meet your initial aim. Your evaluations could provide more depth of analysis and explain your choices and justifications for your decisions.

Presentation – You presented your work on SoundCloud but this could have been released on streaming platforms with more careful consideration and planning. You could have completed artwork to accompany the track but this is not available. The final track is a good piece of work that demonstrates all the skills that you have developed over the past two years as a music producer. The quality of the work could be improved with more time spend on the arrangement and more finesse on the mixing, which was largely due to a lack of commitment in the final stages of the project.

Well done, Blake, you have completed the project to a good level, demonstrating a range of skills in the development of a final IDM track that is well produced and effective. You started off excellently with some good research, recording and experimentation. However, the final product could have been a higher quality with a little more time allocated to the final track and as a result it was a little rushed. To improve in the future, you need to stick to your project plan more diligently and provide more in-depth evaluations to inform your work. More thought around promotion and marketing and seeking more feedback throughout your project would certainly have helped improve the presentation of your work. You have developed greatly as a drummer, producer and musician throughout the two years Blake, well done.

Second Marker comments:

This was an interesting project that built on what you had done in the previous year, completing a track using Ableton. You've done some good research, including primary research in speaking to the drum teacher. Just work on your referencing as it isn't clear where you found the information on synthesis and drum replacement. You've documented the process well, but it looks like you struggled towards the end and ended up making something less challenging that didn't incorporate what you'd originally planned. The evaluation doesn't go into enough detail here to explain what happened here and this is something to develop further. Overall, this is good project with some really strong elements. Well done and good luck for next year. Mark agreed.
