## Commentary as appropriate

Well done Harry, you have completed this project to a Merit standard. The work submitted meets all the assessment criteria and is of a high standard. The final product is really well recorded and mixed, and you have documented this effectively.

Context – You have provided some context in the form of a proposal/presentation and then some research into the style of music you are working in which supports the project well. You completed a vast amount of research through critical listening that informed your experimentation but you should document this more in future. This is an area to develop though and I realise that it's something you found difficult. The contextual research that is on there feels like a bit of a tick-box that's been done at the end, when it could have really helped inform you about the area you were working in.

Research – There is some relevant research into different recording and mixing techniques which effectively supports the project. You have documented this well and it's clearly helped inform your practical skills. You could have developed this further and spent some time looking into more areas related to the project. For example, you could have researched songwriting and promo/marketing, and this would have added another layer to the project.

Practical Skills – The practical skills you have demonstrated are excellent and this is a real strength of yours. You've also documented this well and the final product is really well recorded and mixed. You collaborated effectively too with other musicians, including a singer, as well as performing, recording, mixing and mastering the song. You also contributed strongly to the showcase, performing on bass and guitar. The main area for development is the mixing/recording of the vocal, as this doesn't really sit in the mix as effectively as it could do. Some of the lyrics don't fit as well as they could either.

Evaluation and Reflection – the recording log shows good ongoing evaluation on how things went. You have also included a final evaluation. I think you could have used the reflective cycle a bit more effectively, for example, reviewing each week and evaluating what went well/badly and how you might improve on it. Also think about using vlogs as this might be a better way of reflecting on your progress, as opposed to just typing it.

Harry, this is a really good final product and you should be really proud of how you applied yourself to the practical project. The final tracks are well recorded, mixed and you've presented your practical work really well. The area for development is the contextual and research elements as these aren't as strong as the practical work. The other area is to push yourself on the songwriting a bit more – these were songs that already existed prior to the project, and creating new ones would have provided another feature of the project. On the whole though, well done!



## **Second Marker comments:**

Harry, you worked hard all the way through this project from start to finish and the final product is the result of all your commitment and effort. I know you were disappointed not to be able to perform your final tracks live at the showcase but you adapted and collaborated and performed with other peers which showed excellent professionalism. I know you have found the academic side of this course hard but you have managed to demonstrated a good understanding of the project and it's context along with relevant research that is directly applied to improve your project. You have also evaluated effectively throughout. With more progress in the areas of context, research and evaluation you could improve your grade even more as your practical skills are excellent. Overall, well done!
