



PROJECT 2:

GRAFFITI

For my second look, I've chosen something very arty and something I've not done before. I've researched different graffiti street artists who inspired me and had a similar vibe to match my look. To go with this look I'll be planning my hair and why I chose each part.



ARTIST RESEARCH:



Banksy, one of the most famous street graffiti artists, apparently born 1974 from Bristol UK is an anonymous artist often known for his ~~autho~~ antiauthoritarian art often done in public places. His most famous piece is 'Girl with the balloon' and 'Exit through the gift shop'. Banksy has famously installed his own work on the walls of New York museums and The Metropolitan Museum.



David LaChapelle's work is mainly vibrant tones so I was inspired the most by his work. His work consists of comic references, gothic art and fashion realism. His work retails from \$1k to \$45k.





Eduardo Kobra, the 47 year old Brazilian street artist specialises in coloured realism. He started when he was 8 years old and by 12, he started murals outside buildings.



Through his work, Eduardo expresses his beliefs, values, principles and his family. As well as that he also uses his art to raise



awareness on things like, history, environmental protection and religion issues.



The main materials he uses are: brushes, spray paints and airbrush. His painted people such as: Anne Frank, Mother Theresa and Martin Luther King.

DESIGN PROCESS:



For this look, I'll be creating a mix of smiley faces on the face using a mix of neon pigments, coloured bases and black

liner for the detailing. I'll be also including some smaller smiley faces down the neck and including some yellow paint swipes / marks to tie the full look together. My main inspiration for this look is an Instagram MUA called @divinamuse. Instead of a nude lip shown in the photo, I'll be including a glossy black lip.



PRACTISE RUN:


For my practise run of my look, I mainly practiced what products I'd use to create the brightest yellow for the smiley faces. After originally planning on using yellow snazaroo face paint, I decided to

use a yellow plouise base to create the shape, then use a neon yellow loose pigment to ~~part~~ set the base. This was the easiest way to create the brightest



colour without disturbing the base makeup under. Also after practicing this look, I decided to incorporate some smiley faces and brush marks going down the neck and onto the chest to tie in the look and also use some body art skills.
