## Recording (assessor LB)

You have not provided any evidence of context and research within your recording project; this is a great shame as you have an excellent understanding of recording equipment and processes as demonstrated throughout the recording project and live sound. Practically you excel in music production, you show mastery and a professional attitude to all the work involved and you are accurate in mic choice and positioning. Your evaluation is only satisfactory as there is limited detail and analysis of the processes and final product of the recording project. This is a shame as you are very aware of these but limited in response on digital space.

## Mixing (assessor JD)

There is some really good work on this blog, especially on the Kings of Leon track. You've shown good control of the levels and the parts are well panned and sit nicely within the mix. The vocal processing is good, with some automated delay which enters in the second half of the song. There is a lot of distortion on one of the guitars and this could have been a bit lighter – the left guitar is a bit out of sync too. I really like the volume build up towards the last chorus and this shows good use of automation. Some more reflection on this track would have been good, especially through comparing it to commercial mixes, with targets set for future improvement. You've done what you can with 'Snake Eyes', considering it's just rhythm parts. Adding a vocal on top of this track would sit well over the parts you've mixed so far. On the whole, there's some good work here, especially practically, just try and reflect/evaluate your mixes more effectively, and think about how you might improve in the future.
