Recording and Mixing (assessor LB)

Clarke, you have provided some good research here but it is vital that you provide Harvard referencing to demonstrate where you are sourcing these references. You have contextualized the research with your favorite artists, which is an effective way to incorporate your understanding of recording techniques.

Instead of explaining what each module is, i.e. compressor, gate EQ, it would be more beneficial to explain how and why you have used them in your mix and what you hope to acquire from them. The mix screen shots don't really help to explain why you used those effects and settings. A screen capture video would been far more effective and helpful in explaining this. Remember its more important, why you used those effects rather than explaining what you did.

The recording is good overall, you managed to capture the sounds well without too many issues. The guitar is a little fuzzy and close to clipping. The drums sound full and bright, without clipping and the dynamics are well maintained. The mix overall is good but there are some periods when the lead guitar overpowers the whole mix and the balance is off set. There is a little bit more refinement to practice to ensure the levels are consistent and the balance is accurate, but this is still a good first mix for your track. Evaluation is mostly focused on the performance aspect, which is still very important but remember this project is studio recording so the focus should be on the planning, recording and mixing processes. How could you have improved the overall mix, or the individual instrument mixes, what effects worked well what might you use differently, did you use any of the research and incorporate it in to your project?
