Commentary as appropriate:

Well done, Clarke, you have completed this project to a Distinction standard. The work submitted meets all the assessment criteria and is of a Distinction standard.

Context – It is clear that you understand the context of music performance and the main elements that function as fundamentals to a good performance. There is evidence that you have worked hard to prepare for the final performance and your inspiration is present within your own style. It will be exciting to see you develop your own style in future projects.

Research – There is an extensive amount of research for each section of your performance, this is excellent and demonstrates you have spent time exploring research on stage presence, style, music theory, singing etc. You did however miss an opportunity to demonstrate how you had applied this research into your project, for instance, a video on singing warms ups applied would have been really useful to evidence how the research was applied directly. There is evidence of this ni your performance and rehearsals, but it could have been more direct, providing more clarity of application.

Practical Skills – Excellent practical skills throughout, there is detailed evidence of your development and progress. Your singing ability has significantly improved since the last project, but you must take more care of your voice, as you could permanently damage without proper care and extensive warm up. You have applied lots of the research into your practical rehearsals, but did you warm up and follow the videos you researched?

Evaluation and Reflection – Your evaluation videos are funny and work well to demonstrate your progress and development, this style works well for you and has helped you to evidence your progress during the project. The dressing gown wasn't included in the stylistic research which is a shame as it may have worked well on stage. 30 plus minutes for a YouTube video is a bit long to maintain interest, it would be better to keep these short and concise. There is extensive evidence of evaluation throughout the project, including the dress and final performance, you have clearly understood the importance of constant reflection to demonstrate your progress and the combination between video and written works well. For future work, consider reducing the amount and refine the quality to ensure that you continue to meet the higher criteria.

Summary – Well done Clarke this is an excellent final project that demonstrates your ability to plan, research, apply and deliver whilst continuously evaluate and reflect on the process. The use of video in combination with written work, works well and helps you to fully evidence your progress and development. The final performance was excellent but please take care of your voice.



Clarke has completed his project to a Distinction standard, meeting all criteria with an excellent level of work. He demonstrated a deep
understanding of music performance context and showed significant progress in his guitar and singing abilities. The research was thorough, though
more direct application of findings could enhance clarity. Practical skills were excellent, with detailed evidence of development, but more organised
and structured documentation is needed to clearly demonstrate his process and findings. While his evaluations were engaging and effectively
documented progress, shorter, more regular and concise videos would improve viewer engagement. Overall, Clarke delivered an outstanding
project, showcasing his ability to plan, research, and execute with continuous reflection and development.
