Commentary as appropriate:

Well done Lukass, you have achieved a Merit – your project submission meets all the assessment criteria and is completed to a high standard.

**Research** – Your research identifies useful resources that are directly relevant to your project. You have carefully selected these resources and explained how they have helped you in your music performance and production skills. The research demonstrates your ability to find and implement research effectively. You could have provided more research to demonstrate a wider field of view and you should also try to apply Harvard formatting for all references.

**Planning and Production** – You have planned and produced recordings and performances to a very high standard, well done. You have a detailed proposal process beginning with your initial project ideas, right through to your aims and objectives, proposal form and action plan and a well delivered presentation. You applied experimentation and explored different ideas effectively. You have various development logs that describe your process throughout the project and how you have reached the final stages of your project, including songwriting, rehearsing and recording. You could also think about planning marketing and promotion in the future.

**Practical Skills** – You have created a track and performed live in various lineups to an excellent standard. You have demonstrated your development as a guitarist and songwriter over the course of this project and this year. The track and performances demonstrate your strong work ethic and commitment to develop new skills and collaborate with other musicians. With more practice you have the potential develop further as a guitarist, particularly in the area of rhythm and dynamic control.

**Evaluation and Reflection** – You have evaluated and reflected on the development process in the different areas of your work with a reasonable amount of success, although you sometimes discuss a lot about what you did rather than focusing on the strengths and weaknesses of the project as well as how you could improve. You have provided a final evaluation where you think more holistically about why thinks went wrong and how you could have improved the work. You have provided areas of development to but in future these could be more expansive and explore a wider range of areas to develop your progression next year. Setting targets could be a good way to measure your progress more accurately.

Lukass, you have produced an excellent final project with a variety of work on display, including an instrumental recorded track and live performances with a variety of different musicians. You have contributed to many different projects and have been committed to this project from start to finish. I think there was also a lot more work that didn't make its way on to your portfolio, for example, the extensive rehearsals that took place over a number of weeks with Jozef, Robert and Marcel. You have really developed as a guitarist, songwriter and musician and you should be proud of this project! You could still improve the research and evaluation processes further but overall, an excellent project, well done.
