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Commentary as appropriate:

Well done Ethan, you have achieved a Distinction – your project submission meets all the assessment criteria and is of a very high standard.

Context – You have provided an extensive range of context that explains the focus of this project and what you hope to achieve. You have explored a range technical and musical influences that demonstrate your awareness of the context of your project and you have successfully incorporated these into your final project flawlessly. Your presentation was extremely detailed, demonstrating the knowledge you have acquired in order to propose such a challenging project. You talked confidently and articulately about the processes you would go through to complete the project.

Research – You have provided research into a range of areas that focus on the core techniques required during your project – paintwork, woodwork, components, alongside a history of the P-bass and some performance ideas. The references you have utilised are highly specific and relevant to your project and you have successfully incorporated these techniques, skills into your work to improve the quality of it. The amount of research could have been greater as you pointed out in the evaluation, but the choices of research are all valid, useful, and applied directly to the restoration of the bass guitar. It was evident from talking to you throughout the project how knowledgeable you have become about guitar restoration through careful and considered research. You've given the reader a technical understanding of the what is required to restore a bass guitar as well as an in depth insight in to your own restoration style. The references page is not references and actually more research on where you got technical specifications from - you must learn how to Harvard reference correctly for next year.

Practical Skills – The bass guitar that you have restored, complete with paintwork and is fantastic. The end result is stunning – it looks great, plays great and sounds great – you should be really proud! You demonstrated a range of practical skills, from the woodwork, paintwork, components to the to the rehearsals and final performance. All the skills you developed were enhanced through your research and evaluation process. You have documented this well and shown how you have progressed throughout the process. The practical skills you have developed will continue to be useful in future projects and enhance future projects. The diary of the project development is clear and succinct. It provides the reader with an excellent chorological account of your project ranging from when you first for the bass to the finished product. You conducted many more rehearsals with musicians, and this is something you should have documented more, particularly in the initial phases. However, you showcased your final bass to a live audience through a presentation and performances.

Evaluation and Reflection – Your performance evaluations are clear and effective; they highlights the strengths and weaknesses of your performances. Your project evaluation is brief but it does pin points areas to improve for future projects – although keeping up to date with portfolio work is an area to be reflected on and addressed. The evaluation is effective in use throughout the development, even though your evaluations may have fallen behind at times it was evident that you used evaluation continually to improve your restoration, development and performance throughout the project. These audio clips are excellent illustrations of how evaluation and reflection should be used, although I am certain you could have added more detail. You have organised your evaluation clearly, expanding on the pros and cons for every group you performed with in the showcase.

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Ethan, this is a really excellent project from start to finish. You have challenged yourself with something creative and quite difficult to do, and the way you stuck at this was admirable. You worked really hard on your research and context, before putting this into practice with the final product, which was excellent. The evaluation and reflection has played a big part of the project, and informed the development of ideas. This is an outstanding piece of work that demonstrates your ability to take on a final project and complete it effectively and successfully. Please do consider your time management with regards to portfolio work for next year!

Second Marker Comments:

Ethan this was a really imaginative and interesting project to take on, and one that will definitely benefit you in the long term. You have documented the process really well and it shows how committed you have been to completing this effectively. Playing the bass in the final performance really capped it off and demonstrated how good the restoration was. The audio evaluations work really well and could have been extended further.
