Comments:

Well done Albert, you have completed this project to a satisfactory standard. The work submitted meets all the assessment criteria and is of a satisfactory standard. You have shown you are very capable practically in this project and you have some good aspects to your portfolio.

Context - You could have provided an very introduction that clarifies your aims and purpose with some examples from the music industry. You show understanding of context throughout the performance you researched, rehearsed and performed.

Research – This was sufficient but lacking a detailed and expansive exploration into the subject matter ensuring a broad range of resources have been implemented. You must look to implement research from a wider range of sources and reference carefully in order to reach a higher grade.

Problem Solving – You successfully demonstrated the ability to solve problems as and when required with effective and decisive means. Your performance role required problem solving though out and enabled you to show your skills in this area. You should try to develop this within your evaluation to demonstrate further understanding and evaluation of your problem solving skills, it is not about just solving problems but developing your methods and understanding of solving them.

Planning and Production – Your planning and production skills were somewhat limited to a brief description of what you hoped to achieve and a stage layout. You should include the resources you require to complete each task and revisit your production plan to check whether you are on track progressively throughout the project.

Practical Skills – Your performance skills were excellent, you demonstrated a professional approach to the performance at a level expected in a professional performance. You managed to juggle the demands of learning material with little rehearsal time and performing as a group – well done!

Evaluation and Reflection – Evaluative and analysis is well written at the end of the project and honest. There are also some brief evaluations of rehearsals. Make sure you evaluate and reflect in response to each task rather than simply at the end. Try to avoid being too descriptive in ongoing evaluations.

Presentation - You have structured and presented your work effectively but there are some duplicate pages and also blank pages. You could try other submission methods such as audio/video for evaluations and written work if this would help. The presentation of your final performance on stage worked well. You could consider standing whilst performing in future.

Well done Albert, you worked well as a band member to create a very successful performance to a sold out audience! It is a shame that you did not enjoy this project, as stated in the final evaluation, as you really improved as a keyboard player and working in a band. These were not easy parts to learn and you really added another dimension to the groups performance. I agree, it is a shame you were not able to fulfil your role as sound engineer on the night, although you did gain experience of this throughout setting up B25 and running sound in the earlier weeks of the project – this could have been documented easily. Look at the areas of the matrix you need to improve on as you are more than capable of a good grade!
