## **Unit 11: Exploration of Specialist Study and Context**

During Project 3 you will explore the specific skills and attributes required for performance in the performing arts industry. You will be working creatively to devise an original piece of theatre for a live audience. You will take part in developmental workshops and be expected to respond to given stimulus to develop your work. As part of your role, you are responsible for the overall production and must work as a team to ensure all production elements are completed successfully. This project will require you to carry out research and critically examine the influence of historical and contemporary contexts on the development of your ideas and how this informs your own practice. You will give a great deal of thought to your audience and present your skills within your chosen discipline.

To support the production you will complete a visual online portfolio, you will have classes to support with the building of this work weekly.

To finalise the project, you will have the opportunity to evaluate your experience and ideas which should discuss the potential of the work created. You must include strengths and weaknesses of the piece and set targets for your next project. This is a good opportunity to start to think about not only the performance aspect but the wider production roles within a theatre-based setting.

This unit will provide you with an opportunity to integrate and reinforce knowledge and understanding acquired through your first term.

They will also enable you to demonstrate your understanding throughout the production and performance of physical and devised theatre performance work on a fast pace turnaround.

Throughout the process you will document a scrapbook which will inform the reader of your experience in production. You must include key information on: the staff team recommend splitting you scrapbook into the following 6 sections!

Context, Research, Planning, Practical exploration (including weekly logs SWT!)

Problem Solving Chart, Analysis and Evaluation. (Please refer to the grading Matrix for reference)

To finalize the project, you will have the opportunity to evaluate your experience and ideas which should discuss the potential of the work created in professional, artistic and vocational terms. You must include strengths and weaknesses of the piece and set targets for your next project.
